Incoming - Application in 8 Steps

These steps are for students who want to study in Göttingen through the Erasmus + Programme KA 131 (home country within Europe).

1. Apply at your home university

Apply for the Erasmus + Programme KA 131 at your home university.

2. Application at the University of Göttingen

If you have been nominated by your home university, you have to register via an <u>online form</u> at the University of Göttingen.

3. Print registration form & signature

Please print the registration form after entering the data. Correct incomplete and incorrect information and sign it.

Your Erasmus + coordinator at your home university must also sign the registration form. Send the signed registration form by email to <u>xiaoting.he@zvw.uni-goettingen.de</u>.

4. Confirmation of your registration

As soon as we have received your online registration, you will be admitted to study in Göttingen and you will receive a Welcome Package with all important information to prepare for your stay abroad.

5. Preparation of the Learning Agreement

Prepare a Learning Agreement with your Erasmus + Departmental Coordinator at your home university, which includes your study plan in Göttingen. The Learning Agreement has to be signed by you and the responsible Erasmus + Programme Coordinator at your home university. Send the signed document to your <u>Erasmus + Departmental</u> <u>Coordinator</u> at the University of Göttingen.

6. Visa

Students from EU and EEA countries (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) do not need a visa to enter Germany. A valid identity card or passport is sufficient.

Students from the Erasmus + programme countries North Macedonia, Serbia, and Turkey and Erasmus+ partner countries usually need a visa for entry. You also need a visa if you are studying at a European university but are a national of a country outside the EU.

Please allow enough time as the processing can take several weeks.

7. Enrolment

About 2 months before the start of your studies, you will receive detailed information about enrolment at the University of Göttingen from Ms. He by mail. You can be enrolled ahead of time even before you arrive in Göttingen. This makes it easier for you to plan your courses and studies. Early enrolment is voluntary. You can also enrol on-site at the beginning of the semester.

- Proof of valid health insurance
- Proof of the payment of the semester fee

Note: As part of your enrolment, you will have to pay a total fee of approx. 320 Euro. This <u>semester fee</u> changes every semester and includes a Studentenwerk fee, student body fees (Studierendenschaftsbeitrag), and the semester ticket including:

- train ticket: free use of many local trains within the federal states of Lower Saxony and Bremen as well as to Hamburg Hauptbahnhof, Kassel Wilhelmshöhe, Paderborn, Nordhausen (via Walkenried) for students
- bus ticket: free rides on the city buses in Göttingen as well as Bovenden and Rosdorf
- **culture ticket:** heavily discounted or even free admission to cultural institutions such as theatres, museums, but also music events in pubs or cultural centres

8. Introductory event in Göttingen

We will give you important information about living and studying in Göttingen in the <u>Introductory event for</u> <u>exchange students</u>. The event takes place during the introductory week for all international students. Take advantage of the opportunity to get informed, get to know other students and connect!

9. Recommended Language Skill for Psychology Modules

All the Psychology courses at our university are taught in German and we therefore require a **B2-level in German** before the exchange. This level is necessary to follow the content of the courses and actively take part in the seminars.
