Susanne Opfermann is professor of American Studies at Goethe-University, Frankfurt am Main. She is the author of *Diskurs, Geschlecht und Literatur: Amerikanische Autorinnen des 19. Jahrhunderts*, and has done recovery work on American women writers, particularly Elizabeth Stoddard (co-editing *Elizabeth Stoddard: Stories*, and translating *The Morgesons* into German). Further research interests include ethnic literatures and cultures in the United States and Animal Studies. She is a founding member of the Cornelia Goethe Center for Gender Studies at Goethe-University and has been a visiting scholar and professor at Harvard, University of California at Berkeley, University of British Columbia, Vancouver, and Smith College.
